1. Disassemble your fountain pen into its three core parts: cap, grip, and barrel. Make sure all parts are dry, clean, and free of residual ink.

NOTE: Do not remove the nib from the grip.

2. Stretch the o-ring over the threads and apply a small amount of grease all the way around the threads with your finger.

3. Fill a syringe with ink from your selected bottle and carefully fill the pen barrel.

NOTE: Do not overfill the barrel and avoid getting ink on the threads.

4. Reassemble the pen, making sure not to overtighten. Wipe away any excess grease and make sure the seal is leak-proof.

5. Put the cap back on the pen and place it face down in an empty cup to allow the feed to saturate. In a few minutes your pen will be ready to use.

A few pen tips:

- Confirm the pen you are using has a water tight barrel.
- To avoid ink dripping from the nib, keep your pen at least 1/3 full.
- Avoid using acrylic, India, or other pigmented inks in your fountain pen.
